March 23rd schedule changes

In response to Coronavirus (COVID 19) Okanogan County Transportation will only run services Monday through Friday.

<u>Local door to door services will have limited hours</u>. Please call at least a day ahead of time to schedule rides. As you know, most services are closed so please be sure you can get in to where you want to go before making an appointment with OCTN. If you have appointments previously scheduled, please check to make sure they are still accepting you and cancel your ride if not.

Congregate meals have been suspended but you can still get a ride to pick up a meal at the senior centers and go directly home.

OCTN buses are sanitized daily.

We are also asking you to please try to observe social distancing on your bus ride.

We take the health and safety of the public and our employees very seriously. With the concern of COVID 19, OCTN is following the guidelines of the Public Health Department and want to encourage the public to do the same:

- Wash your hands often with soap and water, use alcohol-based sanitizer when soap and water aren't available
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth with unwashed hands
- Disinfect objects and surfaces
- Cover your mouth/nose with a tissue of sleeve when coughing or sneezing
- Avoid close contact with people who are sick
- Stay home and away from others if you are sick
